LA VIE NOUS APPARTIENT (INTRODUCTION)

"La Vie Nous Appartient" is a psychological drama about two students, Sarah and Philip, who after meeting online develop a tragic plan to end their lives. The two decide to meet in person and hike into the mountains in the heart of Austria where Sarah used to go with her father as a child. During this journey, as they share stories, thoughts and struggles, they find that perhaps neither of them is quite as alone as they had thought.

Filmed among the rocky hills and forests of Lower Austria, "La Vie Nous Appartient" is a probing, but also lighthearted film. Through an up-close view of two individuals, it looks into enduring issues about family, depression and fulfillment while also touching upon the unique issues of growing up in the modern world.

Suicide is a significant issue among adolescents. It is the second highest cause of deaths among Austrian teenagers - only traffic accidents causes more deaths. According to the OECD (Organization for Economic Co-Operation and Development), Austria has the 6th highest suicide rate among 15-19 year olds, after New Zealand, Finland, Norway, Canada and Ireland. A large audience worldwide can identify well with this issue, and an empathetic story such as La Vie Nous Appartient may allow affected people (vulnerable teens, survivors, parents and friends) to find hope and some answers to their struggles.

The film was made with the support of Kultur Niederosterreich (Lower Austria Cultural Fund) and starting private investment which allowed production to begin. The cast shines with two upcoming French actors, Alix Bénézech (her latest short movie, *Le Quepa sur la vilni!* de Yann Le Quellec, world premiered at *La Quinzaine des Realisateurs* in Cannes this year) and Florent Arnoult, and reunited film professionals from 10 different nationalities (Austria, Germany, Italy, France, Netherlands, Romania, Brazil, South Korea, US and Argentina). The original soundtrack has been written and performed by Austrian-Argentine composer, Tomás Leonhardt, while the ending titles song, *Voices in My Head* has been composed for the occasion by Dutch-Italian Rock Band *theFilmakers*.

Alex is of Korean descent, but was born in Austria and educated in the UK, France, Switzerland and the US, where he graduated from Oberlin College with a B.A. in Political Science and Economics, before obtaining a M.A. in International Business. Alex's path to directing came over script writing, soon fascinated by the art of telling compelling stories from paper to screen. After working on a number of short films and related projects in different roles, Alex made his directing feature film debut with "La Vie Nous Appartient".

DIRECTOR'S STATEMENT

A movie about suicide can't be life-affirming and positive!" This was the common reaction when I first presented the idea of "Maybe Tomorrow". Yet, the movie is exactly that, and especially considering that not all too long ago I myself was wandering through life as a troubled teenager, I would never want to glorify or romanticize suicide.

The story is only partly based on real people: the two characters should rather be seen as symbolizing teenagers in general. Philip and Sarah have the typical problems, worries and fears. What they are lacking is the parental and social net that can catch them and convince them that there are solutions other than killing themselves. Instead, they fall into an emotional pit that they can no longer see a way out of. They fail to recognize that their problems, while potentially serious, are not earth-shattering. They couldn't care less that far away people are starving, because their life is happening NOW, and their worries are burdening them considerably more in this here and now. While in the beginning the two teenagers are acting up and pretending that "it's not all that bad anyway", their true feelings quickly emerge. Eventually, they are faced with the decision of whether to really jump or not. The viewer sees every minute, follows their conversation and experiences their transition.

The second question that I am asked inevitably is why I didn't choose a "conventional" narrative method, in other words showing how Philip and Sarah are airing in chats, with schoolmates, and with their family, before they meet as planned. It's not about what is truly happening in their lives. Are they exaggerating? Maybe. Have they gotten too worked up about something? Probably. But all that is irrelevant because it's about how they fell NOW, with all their emotions, their powerlessness and their desire to escape it all. This is their reality at that moment, regardless of the truth of their perception. The viewer should witness the world they exist in, emphatize with them and learn to understand them.

It is clear to me that this narrative method is most demanding of the actors, which is why I chose to write the script in English at first, not only to appeal to a larger international market, but also to be able to choose among the best young actors from all over Europe. The very same choice brought us to the attention of Alix Bénézech and Florent Arnoult, two young talented actors from Paris who were perfect in their interaction, even outside the casting room. After seeing them on and off screen, it became a natural choice to adapt the script in French and have them perform in their original language. This is how "Maybe Tomorrow" became "La Vie Nous Appartient" and how a small independent Austrian movie brought two young French actors on the hills surrounding Vienna.

As for most events in our life, sometimes a simple pause is needed for thought to recognize some light and hope and this is the spirit with which I hope audiences and film festival juries will perceive this film.


